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LETTER FROM THE CHAIRMAN

Hi All,

I hope everyone has been keeping safe over the last couple of months , I am getting very tired of all the restrictions during covid 19 ,not going out ,not meeting people for coffee and a chat, thankfully people have started to get vaccinated and the end is in sight ,shops pubs and hotels will start to reopen and I have also received my call about getting my vaccine and I can't wait,I have been off work since last November because not only do I have an ileostomy I also have a doggy heart and cannot risk mixing with the public because I work in retail.

With the National Vaccination Programme progressing and the hope that 70%+ of the population will have received their vaccination before End of June. I am more optimistic now that once we have approval from HSE/NPHET we can have a Public Meeting for members with Ostomy companies exhibiting their Ostomy Products at the end of October/early November. I am in discussion with the Ostomy Companies to sound out their interest in us holding such a meeting. The guestion of a suitable venue has to be considered and it is felt that the Ashling Hotel is restrictive because of size of room available. I intend to explore if the Red Cow Hotel offers a better option. We would look at the feasibility of having a shuttle bus service from Heuston Station to the Hotel and also from the Hotel back to Heuston Station

During March and April I have partaken in a few webinars and zoom meetings about new products and better ways to look after anyone that has an ostomy. As we are now coming into the summer months I always start taking a dioralyte drink every day as it helps me stop getting dehydrated and headaches .

We have been working on producing three Booklets in collaboration with some of our Ostomy Company Social Corporate Sponsors. These Booklets will hopefully go to print in July/August.

The Titles of the Booklets are:

1. Living Life To The Full with a Stoma or Internal Pouch



2. Nutrition and Dietary Advice for Ostomates



3. Going on Vacation – Holiday advice for Ostomates.





We are also exploring through our insurance broker BHP to be able to offer a good Travel Insurance Package for our members which is specially for Ostomates with pre-existing medical conditions.

Mark despite his recent health difficulties and who is presently recuperating from his recent Colostomy surgery on 31 March has committed a considerable amount of time in preparing Documents for OAI so that we can submit the final documents to complete our application for Charitable Status. Our Policy Document 2021 to 2025 is now available in PDF format on our website. We hope that we will have completed all steps required for registration as a Charitable Organisation by 15 June 2021.

I would like to thank all the members who have contacted us to let us know that they have Ostomy products they want to donate to the Moldova Project. Due to COVID travel restrictions there has been some difficulty picking up product or it was not possible for you to deliver to us especially to Tullamore where we have to prepare an inventory list of the contents of each box which we are sending to Moldova. I wish to especially acknowledge the support we have received from Caroline Flynn, Pharmacy Manager at CARA PHARMACY, Dun Laoghaire who donated a huge amount of Ostomy products which might have otherwise been dumped.

The Moldova project which began as a small pilot project has grown faster than we ever thought possible. The success and the response we have received from the

Hospitals and Cancer Hospitals who have benefitted from the product we have sent is providing a new lease of life for so many ostomates in Moldova, is that they have been overwhelmed by what we have sent to them. Cimislia Hospital who received the first batch of product we sent last December has networked with so many other hospitals and they have been able to contact other hospitasl in their region and also one of the main hospitals in the Capital City Chisinau has received some of the ostomy product which is also benefitting so many people there. Please if you have any surplus ostomy product no matter how small we will be happy to receive it from you. There are 4 trucks come to Dublin each week with produce and all have responded generously and deliver the boxes of Ostomy products at no cost. Every part of this project is voluntary and most worthwhile of your support. THANK YOU.

SECRETARIES REPORT

Many of you have hopefully received your COVID vaccination already or are scheduled soon to receive your vaccination. After such a long time of COVID restrictions we can now hopefully look forward to being able to return to some degree of living normal lives again and meeting up with family, friends and our support groups. We are waiting to see what advice the HSE and NEPHET say about us being able to hold a Public Meeting with Ostomy Companies in attendance at the end of October/early November. We hope support group meetings can start meeting again in January 2022. Although it has not been possible to hold meetings some support groups have been active with their members using WhatsApp or having zoom meetings. We are now in an era of technological advancement but not all of us are IT literate and have a smart phone, tablet, laptop or desktop computer. Many of you do not send or receive emails, use WhatsApp, Twitter or YouTube. It has been a big step forward that 40%+ of our membership are happy to be contacted by email through the Send in Blue communication programme and to be able to access our journal Ostomy Ireland News in PDF format on the OAI Website.

We are looking again at holding a Survey/Questionnaire of our members in the Autumn. It will primarily be concentrating on the Medical Expenses Ostomates incur especially when they do not have a Medical Card. One of the objectives we set when establishing OAI was to lobby for all Ostomates irrespective of their income to be entitled to a Medical Card as a primary entitlement due to having a Stoma or Internal Pouch as we do not have an illness but a Lifelong Medical Condition. In order to advocate our case we need statistics and the Survey/Questionnaire would be looking for information from you on what costs you incur monthly for your Ostomy products and medications .

The Survey/Questionnaire will be looking again for information on members level of IT literacy and competency. How you wish to be contacted either by post or using IT Technology. In accordance with GDPR your consent is required for us to be able to communicate with you. Any information you provide us with is not shared with any other organisation/company. Once the results of the survey/Questionnaire have been processed the Survey/Questionnaire Booklets will be shredded in accordance with GDPR guidelines. Information will be asked about private health Insurance, Medical Card History, have you been refused a Medical Card or had a Medical Card withdrawn. Information on Travel - use of Public and Private Transport




Do you take out travel insurance when travelling - is it through a broker, Health Insurer, Bank or other. This information will help us when lobbying for the benefit of our members. The Survey/Questionnaire will seek information on Quality of Life - Living Life to the Full. Do you engage in sporting activities, exercise, walking etc. Do you have hobbies or engage in creative activities drama, singing, play a musical instrument, creative writing, painting, knitting or sewing. Do you have a garden and enjoy working in the garden. It is hoped through the Survey/Questionnaire that Ostomates will be encouraged and get fulfilment engaging in any of these activities and will be able to say they are Living Life to the Full.

Having a Stoma does not mean you become isolated and hide away from family, friends and neighbours. Nobody knows looking at you that you have a stoma and it is no longer taboo to have surgery which involves diversion of bladder or bowel through a stoma. We all know our limitations and precautions and preparedness we need to take when going out or going on a long journey. Meeting other Ostomates at Support Group Meetings will give you encouragement and support and you will be surprised when you are doing many things you thought you would never do.



MY LIFE MY STOMA MARY MCLOUGHLIN



My name is Mary McLoughlin, I am the coordinator of the Sligo Stoma Support Group and this is my story.

I first started to have symptoms when I was 18 years old in 1972 and weighed about eight and a half stone. This continued for about two years until I noticed blood in the mucus that I was passing.

I had never told anybody about the mucus but when I saw blood I got frightened and decided to go to my G. P. This led to a refferal to a surgeon as well as admission to Sligo General Hospital . I received an examination of my bowel under anaesthetic. At this point cancer was ruled out, but no other diagnosis was made.

I got married that year and was pregnant with our first child a few months later - this was my cure for nine months. As soon as my baby was born the blood and mucus returned. I had three other children in the next five years and each time I went into remission during the pregnancies.

I became very ill after our fourth child was born and had to be hospitalized and placed on a drip for a week. It was now 1982, ten years on, and at this stage the word "colitis" was mentioned for the first time. I was prescribed a drug called salazopyrn as well as a course of antibiotics and discharged, but two weeks later I was readmitted with a bad reaction to the drug. The decision was made that I should undergo a course of iron and vitamin injections .

The surgeon brought me back every month for check ups but there was no other medication to give for my colitis. I had lost a stone weight and was now seven and a half stone. At my next appointment a new drug was mentioned but it was not on the GMS and would cost 250 pounds for a month supply. It was called Asacolon. This drug worked for me for a few years and after several letters to the minister for health and local TDs it was added to GMS.

In 1985 I began to get very sick again and was then referred to a Gastroenterologist in Dublin and had my first of many colonoscopies. At this time I received a definite diagnosis of Ulcerative Colitis.

More new drugs were prescribed, Pentasa, Steroid enemas, and asacolon suppositories - then a fifth pregnancy gave me a further 9 months of remission.



After my last pregnancy, what followed was 10 years of different combinations of drugs being prescribed – all while on a continuous course of oral steroids. The last attempt at a solution was weekly infusions of IV steroids in 1997. At this stage, I was spending much of my time in bed.

With options exhausted, my Gastroenterologist referred me to a colorectal surgeon in Beaumont Hospital.

My operation was performed in November 1998 and then in May 2000 I had to return to have my rectum removed. After the second surgery, I can honestly say that after 26 years, I finally had my life back.

At that time there were no support groups but our stoma nurse Susan Moore had just arrived in Sligo University Hospital and was my guardian angel when I returned home from Beaumont Hospital after surgery.



The following year, 2000, Susan set up the Sligo Stoma Support Group with just six members. Our group has grown from strength to strength And now we have over 50 members.

At first our meetings were held in Sligo University Hospital and then we acquired a meeting room at The Embassy rooms, John F Kennedy Parade Sligo compliments of Kevin Quinn, the proprietor. Our meetings were Bi Monthly at first and gradually our little group began to grow. In order to let people know about our new group, we put articles in local papers, spoke on local radio and arranged meetings in neighbouring counties Leitrim and Donegal to encourage anyone with a stoma to join us. We had over 20 members at this stage.

In 2008 Susan had to take a step back due to work and family commitments so I then took over the role of Coordinator – with Susan always available to offer guidance.

We are a very active group and our main aim is to make our members feel safe, happy, and to enjoy being with like minded people on the same journey. But above all else, we are there to support each other.

We have had many visits to The Hollister Plant in Ballina where Rosemary Rowe and all the team looked after us very well. It is a worthwhile experience as we are taken on a tour of the factory floor and shown how the appliances are made and well as getting to hear the full story of how Hollister was formed.



We also went to the Eakin Plant in Co. Down where we were made very welcome. There, we were given a tour of their plant and got to meet Mr Eakin himself.

In 2009 we formed an alliance with Sligo Cancer Support Centre and we now have our meetings monthly in this beautiful place. We organize fundraising events, sponsored walks, rock n roll Bingo, Raffles and many other events and we share our profits with the Centre.

2017 was a special year for us as we were awarded Sligo Co Council's Cathaoirleach award for the contribution the group made toward promoting health and well-being for people with Bowel and Bladder Disease. This was a wonderful honour for us and we are very grateful to Susan Moore for her nomination.

I organize a Dinner and social get together every year and in the last few years we have progressed to a dinner dance due to the growing numbers in our group. These events are very enjoyable and I feel they are very helpful for the morale of the group. We hosted the first ever National Association Dinner Dance in 2018.

As our group has continued to grow over the years, we started to go on day trips. We've visited Glenview Folk Museum in Ballinamore, gone to see the Greyhound racing in Galway and have taken trips on The Innisfree Cruiser on Lough Gill. In 2016, we began getting more adventurous and started doing some overnight trips. Achill, Belmullet, Downings and Ballyliffin were all visited over the following years until Covid came along and put a stop to all of that. Now I'm 2021, we find ourselves having our monthly meetings via Zoom.



So far the meetings have been very successful but obviously there are quite a few members who do not have internet access so all I can hope for is that we will all be able to meet up in person again soon.

MY LIFE MY STOMA VALERIU DAMIAN



My name is Valeriu Damian I am 72 years old and now working as an Insurance Agent.I studied to become a teacher on completing my secondary education and graduated as a teacher of foreign languages. I taught French to pupils in a secondary school

In 2001, Twenty years ago I was diagnosed with colorectal cancer at the age of 52yrs. Before I could have my surgery it was necessary for me to have 3 months of Chemotherapy. After my surgery during the post operative period it was a very difficult time, and psychologically I found it hard to accept that I had a stoma. I found it difficult to come to terms and accept that I was going to have to live with a stoma for the rest of my life. I had to make one of the most difficult decisions of my life and

realise the limitations having a stoma pouch created for me as a teacher. So I changed my career and worked as an inspector in the Customs Service and since the start of this year I now am working as an insurance agent. Caring for a stoma twenty years ago was very different to how it is now for ostomates. In Moldova we are not able to obtain the ostomy products which ostomates in Ireland have donated to Cimislia Hospital for ostomates living in Moldova. After my surgery I had to learn to use plastic bags to cover my stoma and because the skin surrounding my stoma was not even, trying to secure the bag in place with sticking tape was always difficult.





When I was contacted by Cimislia Regional Hospital and offered stoma pouches for the first time in my life It was like a dream. Receiving adhesive remover sprays and wipes, skin barrier products, deodorants and many other products has changed my life. To describe how my life has now changed, I am lost for words to express how happy I now am.

My Life has now changed and I am able to socialise, meet my family and friends which gives me so much pleasure as I now have the confidence to be able to enjoy Life to the Full. The ostomy product that has changed my life most is the Skin Barrier Film which allows me to make perfect contact with my pouch to my stoma – I now feel completely safe, I feel free.

My lifestyle has changed a lot. It is no longer necessary to check the condition of my pouch every hour. I do not need to carry a few plastic bags with me when I go out. I do not need to use adhesive tape any more to secure the bag and my skin no longer suffers from the irritation which the adhesive tape caused to my skin.

Information Sheet - Leakage

Leakage refers to any output that is present on your baseplate when you change your pouch. It is the no.1 most common problem for ostomates - 92% of ostomates worry about leakage and 77% say they have experienced leakage in the last 6 months.*

What causes leakage?

Leakage happens as a result of your pouch not having a secure enough fit around your stoma and on the peristomal area. Without a snug seal around the centre of your stoma, output can leak underneath your baseplate and this can potentially lead to skin issues and soreness.



Leakage does not necessarily mean your pouch comes away or soils your clothes. It can vary in amount and severity depending on the fit of your baseplate. It's important to highlight that your baseplate should be completely clean when you change your pouch - if it isn't, then leakage has occurred and your fit needs reviewing.



If the underside of your baseplate looks like any of the examples above, then you are experiencing leakage and should contact your Stoma Care Nurse for a review.





Information Sheet - Leakage

How do I know I'm having leakage issues?

- Do you have red or irritated skin, whilst also experiencing stoma output on the skin? This would indicate that output leaking under the baseplate is causing skin issues.
- Does the hole fit the exact shape of your stoma? Has your stoma got smaller or bigger? A poorly fitting pouch could cause leakage. Any gaps around your stoma could cause output to leak onto your skin and cause irritation. You should regularly check if your stoma changes shape or size.
- Has your body shape (body profile) changed? Have you lost or put on weight? Changes to your body profile will affect the fit of your baseplate - you may need a new pouch to accommodate your body profile.

Do you have skin creases or folds around your stoma? This may prevent the adhesive fitting securely onto to the skin around your stoma. You should discuss this with your Stoma Care Nurse.
